Dear Clint:

Recently, we met for pre-arbitration discussion on the above referenced grievance. The issue in this grievance is whether an Officer-in-Charge (OIC) assignment is subject to the same restrictions as those imposed on a 204-B assignment under the MOU Re: Clerk Craft Jobs, Section 2.0.


As full and complete resolution of this case, the parties mutually agree to the following:

The duration provision in Section 2 D) of the Clerk Craft Jobs MOU which states, "The usage of a 204-B in this exception is normally limited to no more than 90 days," is applicable to an OIC assignment except when the assignment is to an installation that employs bargaining unit employees not represented by the APWU and the postmaster position is the only supervisory position.

The parties agree that any grievances pending the outcome of this case shall be resolved pursuant to the applicable agreement stated herein and any issue of remedy, where appropriate, through application of the local fact circumstances.
